No new deaths were reported today by DOH. O'ahu is the only island with double-digit case numbers.

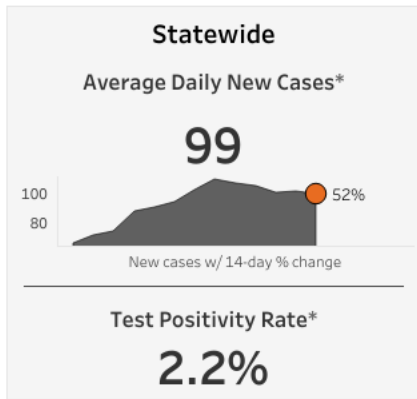

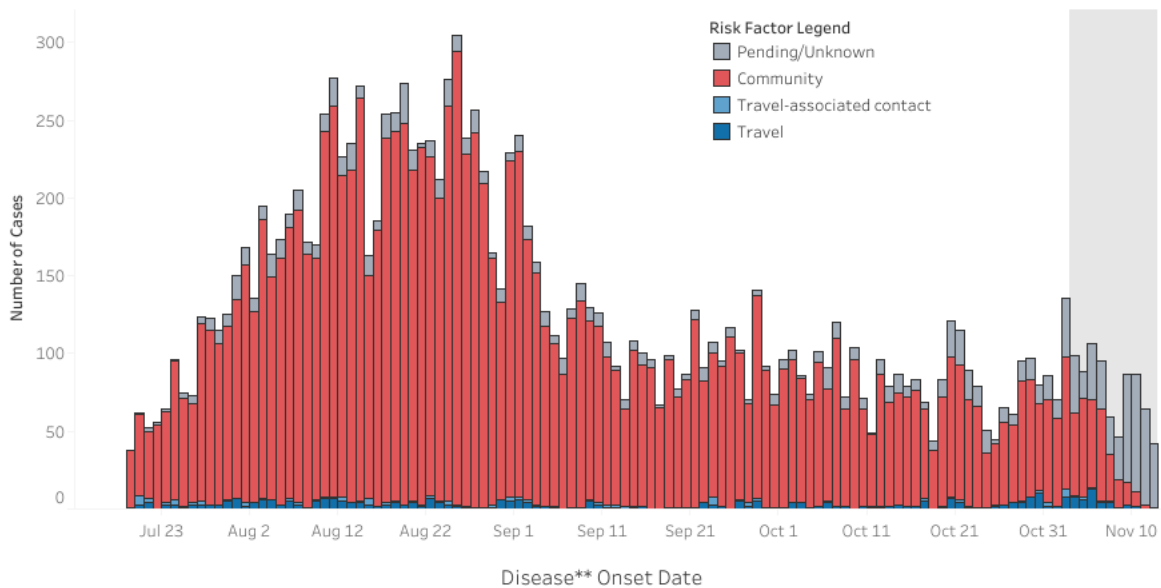

Hawai'i Tourism Authority:

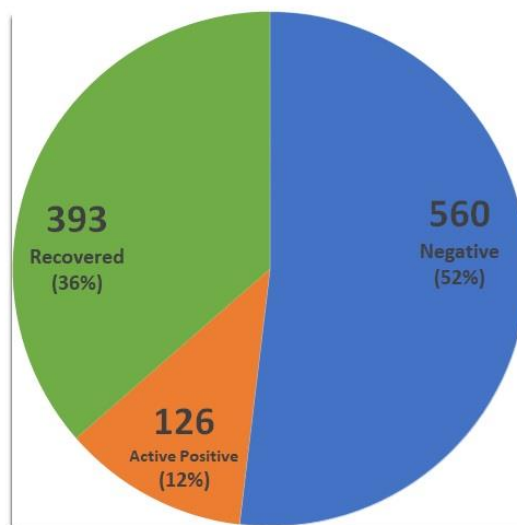

Department of Public Safety: **Testing Update**

Testing of all Hawai'i inmates at the Saguaro Correctional Center in Eloy, AZ was completed on October 29. 662 inmates with first-round negative test results are undergoing re-testing as part of surge testing efforts. An additional 40 re-test results came back positive bringing the total positive results to date to 519.

There are five (5) inmates in the hospital. All other positive inmates are in medical isolation at the facility. The negative inmates remain in a precautionary quarantine. There are currently 1,081 inmates housed at Saguaro. PSD has established an information hotline: 808-587-1421.

DOH testing of O'ahu Community Correctional Center (OCCC) inmates and staff is continuous. There was one (1) positive OCCC staff result and one (1) negative OCCC inmate result reported today. There are no OCCC inmates in the hospital. PSD's Health Care Division is working with DOH, the Hawai'i National Guard (HING) and community partners, to conduct mass testing for COVID-19 at all other correctional facilities statewide. The Hawai'i Community Correctional Center received 44 negative inmate test results. Repeat testing of Kaua'i Community Correctional Center staff resulted in 19 negative results. Additionally, 91% of PSD staff who tested positive for COVID-19 have recovered.

A logistical team, led by David Hafner, created the highly successful HI-EMA PPE and Industrial Hygiene distribution program to distribute free PPE among qualifying groups across the islands. This program, funded by the state, used \$61 million of CARES funds to purchase and distribute personal protective equipment to hospitals, childcare facilities, elderly care facilities, small businesses, non-profits, and schools. WHO IS ELIGIBLE? Residential Facilities, Service Providers & Organizations

- Eldercare Facilities – All facilities that provide residential care for the Elderly- e.g. adult residential care homes, foster family care homes, and assisted living
- Non-Profits – Public facing public service non-profits:
 - Tier 1: Food banks and food distribution; homeless shelters, Disabled Veteran shelters, Youth shelters
 - Tier 2: Mental health and substance abuse; Special Treatment Facilities
- Other recipients include schools, hospitals, independent medical providers, dentist, labs and therapists
- Public Facing Small Businesses with an average of less than 100 working employees prior to quarantine- Home care agencies; Home health care agencies, and Case management agencies, Retail Stores; Restaurants, Accommodation & Small Manufacturing companies.

PLACE YOUR ORDER: Registration and orders are now being accepted by Hawai'i Emergency Management Agency (HI-EMA), which is overseeing the order and distribution of PPE supplies statewide.

After Your Online Registration is Completed:

HI-EMA will contact you to determine your supply order. You will receive approximately 90 days' worth of supplies pending availability. PPE orders will be shipped to your business address including neighbor islands. Currently, the projected delivery is around October/November.

In the meantime, you can request for limited emergency supplies currently in stock through Hawaii Health Management Agency, or can purchase or order directly through private distributors (see Attachment A – PPE Resources)

**Domestic
Trans-Pacific Travel**

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14-Day Quarantine

To Bypass Quarantine:

- Show proof of negative test result upon arrival or remain in quarantine until received
- Must take a nucleic acid amplification (NAAT) pre-travel test within 72 hours from the final leg of departure. The State of Hawai'i will accept test results ONLY from TRUSTED TESTING AND TRAVEL PARTNERS.
- Applies to all passengers ages 5 and over; travelers pay for test
- Must complete Safe Travels Hawai'i online form prior to arrival
- Or other exemption provided by the state
- Travelers arriving in Hawai'i with pending test results will remain in quarantine until negative test results uploaded to the Safe Travels Hawai'i account and Safe Travels Hawai'i issues confirmation by email that traveler is removed from quarantine

Not required

Required at airport up to 25% without quarantine; free

Maui County
Voluntary 72 hours after arrival; free

Kaua'i County
Voluntary 72 hours after arrival; free

To Bypass Quarantine:

- Traveling into City and County of Honolulu**
No test and no quarantine required
- Traveling into County of Hawai'i**
OPTION 1: Pre-test 72 hours prior to departure, same requirements as domestic Trans-Pacific; OR
OPTION 2: Post-arrival test in quarantine until negative test received and verified. May break quarantine to test.
- Traveling into Maui County**
Pre-test 72 hours prior to departure, same requirements as domestic Trans-Pacific
- Traveling into Kaua'i County**
Pre-test 72 hours prior to departure, same requirements as domestic Trans-Pacific
- Or other exemption provided by the state or county

**International
Trans-Pacific Travel**

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14-Day Quarantine

To Bypass Quarantine:

- Travelers from Japan**
Pre-test 72 hours prior to departure, same requirements as domestic Trans-Pacific
- Currently no other pre-travel test exemptions
