



Inmate and Staff Testing Continues

The Halawa Correctional Facility (HCF) reported 78 more inmate test results as part of surge testing efforts. Of that total, 20 were positive and 58 were negative. The facility is reporting 54 more inmate recoveries bringing the total active positive inmate cases down to 241. There are seven (7) inmates hospitalized. There was one (1) new positive HCF staff case reported. Surge testing, with the assistance of DOH, the Hawai'i National Guard and Project Vision Hawai'i, will continue at HCF until there are no new positive cases at the facility. All other facilities that experienced outbreaks have brought their COVID-19 count under control. The O'ahu Community Correctional Center (OCCC) has **zero** active positive inmate cases in the facility. There was one (1) new positive OCCC staff case reported.
