



179 COVID-19 Cases and Six Deaths Reported

DOH reports 179 new cases of coronavirus today and six (6) additional deaths, raising the state's COVID-19 death toll to 318.

- 1 woman, 70-79 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized
- 1 woman, 80-89 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized
- 2 men 90-99 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized
- 1 woman, 100-109 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized

Maui

1 man, 90-99 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized

Department of Public Safety:

Inmate and Staff Testing Continues

The Halawa Correctional Facility (HCF) reports 12 new staff test results. Of that total, one (1) was positive and 11 were negative. Additionally, two (2) more staff have recovered, leaving just 12 active positive staff. There were no new inmate test results. There are six (6) hospitalized HCF inmates. The Oʻahu Community Correctional Center (OCCC) reports 65 inmate results, 63 of which were negative and two (2) inconclusive. Additionally, one (1) inmate, who tested positive prior to entry, has been admitted straight into medical isolation at OCCC. For more information on PSD's planning and response efforts to COVID-19:

7,901 Passengers Arrive on Wednesday

Yesterday, a total of 7,901 people arrived in Hawai'i from out of state. A total 4,025 people indicated they came to Hawai'i for vacation. There were also 1,107 returning residents. The trans-Pacific passenger arrival data is derived from data provided by the Safe Travels digital system.
