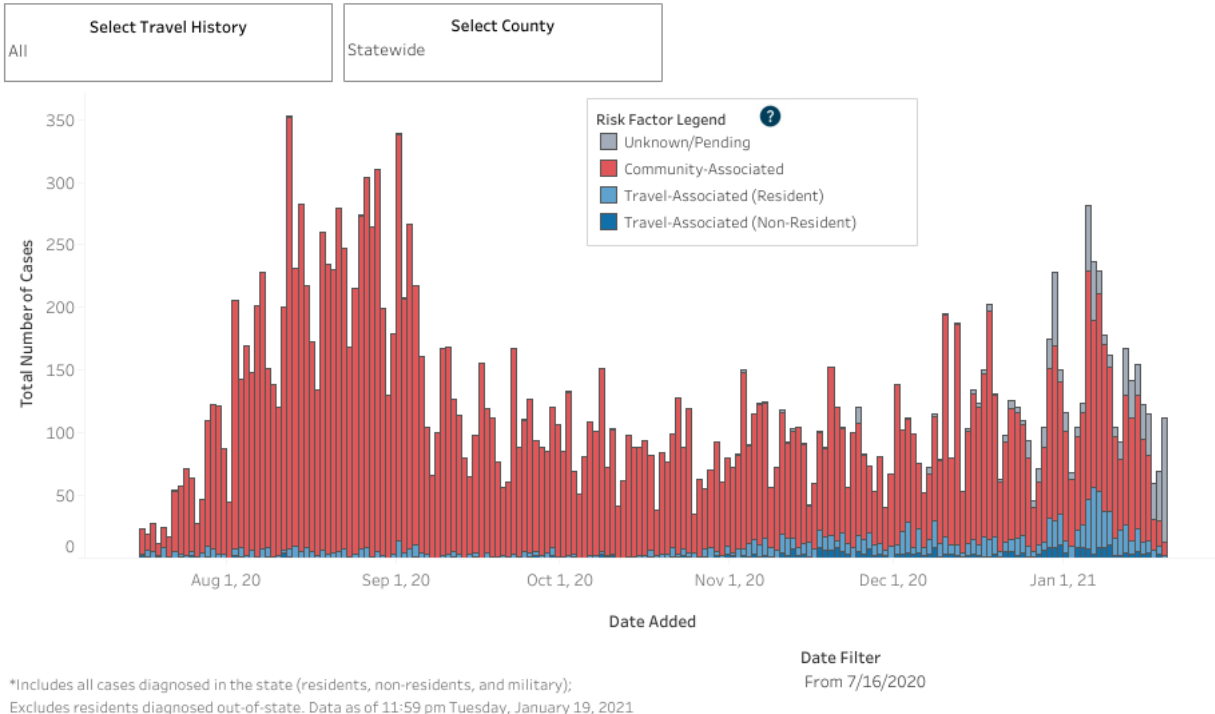

### 119 COVID-19 Cases and Three Deaths Reported

DOH reports 119 new cases of coronavirus today and three (3) additional deaths, raising the state's COVID-19 death toll to 328.

- 1 Man, 60-69 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized
- 1 Man, 80-89 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized
- 1 Woman, 90-99 yrs, underlying conditions, hospitalized
