

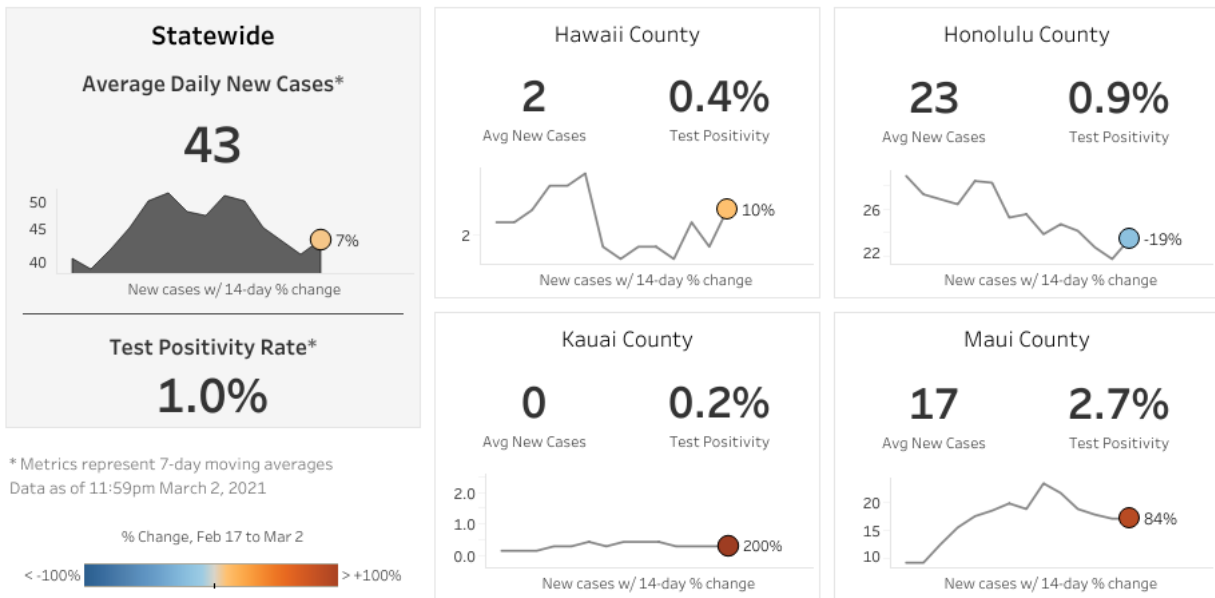

Cumulative Doses Administered*

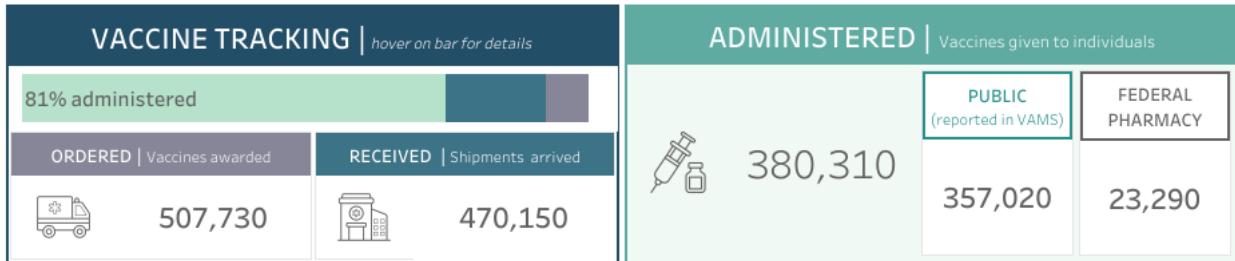

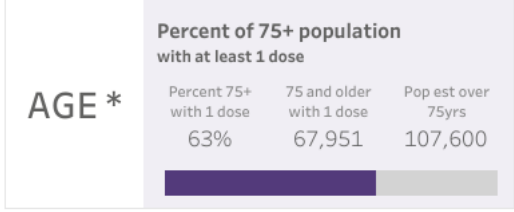

Public Doses Tracking (does not include Federal Agency Doses)

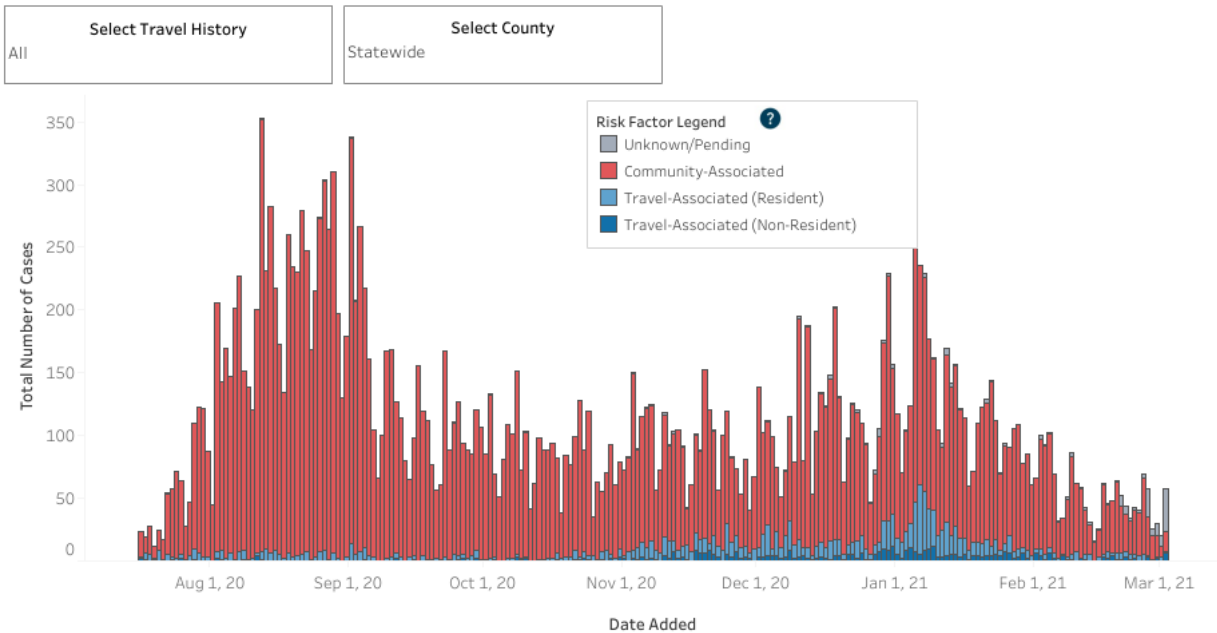

Vaccinations for People 70+ Begin Next Monday

Beginning Monday, March 8 the state is expanding the pool of those eligible for COVID-19 vaccinations.

“We are excited to be ahead of schedule and pleased that we can now provide another layer of protection to this vulnerable population,” said State Health Director Dr. Elizabeth Char. Thus far vaccines have been reserved for healthcare workers, those in long-term care facilities, frontline essential workers and kūpuna 75 and older. “We have vaccinated enough people in those groups that we are able to open eligibility to everyone 70 and above. We will closely monitor how quickly vaccines are used and may open to people age 65 and up and those in phase 1c in a couple of weeks,” Char said.

Department of Public Safety: Statewide Inmate Testing Continues

COVID-19 testing is continuously being conducted statewide at all facilities. The Maui Community Correctional Center (MCCC) reports 35 negative staff test results. The total active positive inmate count at MCCC remains unchanged at 29. All other facility inmate populations are clear of the virus. Hawai'i Tourism Authority: 12,027 Passengers Arrive on Wednesday

Yesterday, a total of 12,027 people arrived in Hawai'i from out of state. A total 7,556 people indicated they came to Hawai'i for vacation. There were also 1,103 returning residents. The trans-Pacific passenger arrival data is derived from data provided by the Safe Travels digital system.
